Part One:

Long description:

Approximately 400 characters

Through interviews, archived footage and photographs, the Confederate Battle flag's history, meaning and impact are examined, from its creation and adoption during the American Civil War; to its resurrection over the South Carolina State House in 1961; to its use as a symbol by Dylan Roof, who, in 2015, killed nine Black parishioners at the historic Mother Emanuel AME Church in Charleston, S.C.

Medium description:

The Confederate Battle flag's history and impact are examined, from its adoption during the Civil War to its resurrection over the South Carolina State House in 1961 to its use as a symbol by Dylan Roof, who, in 2015, killed nine Black parishioners in Charleston, S.C.
