Logo

There are two versions of the *South of Spooky* logo, a full color version and a tan reverse version to appear on darker backgrounds.

Recreation



Do not recreate the logotype.

Reverse Logo

When printing onto a dark background without color printing capability, a tan version of the logo is approved for use.

Distortion

Do not stretch, distort or otherwise modify the logo. This includes the implementation of decorative effects, such as emboss or drop shadow – all of which are prohibited.



Minimum Padding

Minimum Padding around the logo is equal to 25 percent of the height of the logo.

Logo should never print less than 0.5” in width.

Colors

The primary color palette for *South of Spooky* includes tan, red, black, teal and light teal. Teal and red are the brand’s primary colors and should be used so long as the final product passes color accessibility. CMYK colors are recommended for most print jobs. Light teal is the brand’s secondary color and should be used as an accent or in locations where teal and red are not appropriate.

The Gray Man Walks Again And Pawleys Feels the Blow

PAWLEYS ISLAND, April 18 (Special)—The famous legend of the Gray Man, so long associated with this old island, came back to life this week-end. Once again, the Gray Man walked. The next day, heavy winds whipped the island as the Carolina coast was alerted for possible tornadoes.

A woman who has been coming to Pawleys for the past 20-odd years and who is a prominent South Carolinian reported today having seen

edge of the surf, saying, "Look at that man! He's disappearing." None of the others saw him. In a matter of seconds, he became a blur—then nothing.

Friday night, periodic bulletins were issued by the weather bureau on the progress of tornadoes that were coming up from Georgia and Florida and were likely to hit somewhere along the coast. Strong winds lashed the little island all night and all day Saturday.

Old Pawleys Islanders, who enjoy hearing all evidence that might reinforce this old legend of the silent figure in gray who warns


