Lift Every Voice in the Loop event celebrates the premiere of Henry Louis Gates, Jr.'s "Gospel" and PBS KIDS' "Lyla in the Loop"

COLUMBIA, S.C.- South Carolina ETV (SCETV), in partnership with Bible Way Church of Atlas Road, have announced a special premiere screening event, *Lift Every Voice in the Loop*, celebrating the debut of Henry Louis Gates, Jr.'s documentary *Gospel* and the new PBS KIDS' animated series *Lyla in the Loop*.

This family-friendly event invites all ages to join on Wednesday, Feb. 7 from 6 - 8 p.m. at Bible Way Church of Atlas Road located at 2440 Atlas Road in Columbia. Gospel explores the rich history of Black spirituality through sermon and song. Executive Producer, Writer and Host Professor Henry Louis Gates, Jr. examines the origin of Black gospel music, which blended the sacred spirituals with the blues tradition.

Lyla in the Loop follows Lyla, a dynamic seven-year-old girl, who lives in a big city with her close-knit family, fantastical blue sidekick Stu, and a host of relatable and quirky characters in her community. These characters use creative and strategic problem-solving and critical thinking skills to address a range of everyday problems together.

This screening event is free and open to the public. Food will be available to purchase onsite from Jeffrey Lampkin's Country Boy Kitchen from 4:30 p.m. – 6 p.m.
